- Experience with Chronic Disease Management and other relevant speciality areas within the cultural context and impacts for Indigenous people.
- Experience in or a demonstrated commitment to improving Indigenous Health outcomes.
- Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of the social determinants of health issues affecting Indigenous people and how Primary Health Care principles apply in an Aboriginal Community Controlled Health setting.
- Commitment to and understanding of the characteristics of Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations.

While knowledge of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture is helpful, what will really see you thrive in our community is an open mind, willingness to be exposed to culture, and curiosity.
